

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Plumstead Township Master Trail Plan outlines a vision for improving the quality of life in the Township; providing a wide range of outdoor experiences; and supporting economic development through the development of a comprehensive township-wide trail network.

The process of developin this Master Trail Plan included extensive opportunities for public participation to ain insi ht and feedback so that the resultin plan is a direct reflection of the community. In addition to details about the public participation process, the plan includes four components:

- 1. Inventory of Plumstead Township Resources
- 2. The Trails Plan
- . Implementation and Cost
- 4. Maintenance and Operations

Inventory of Plumstead Township Resources

This section of the plan identifies information obtained from field reconnaissance as well as summaries of the followin resource roupin s:


- Natural resources: rivers and streams, wetlands, floodplains, woodlands, topo raphy and a ricultural land
- Man-made resources: roads, utilities, existin trails, and parks and open space
- Historic and cultural resources: covered brid es and historic districts

ome of these resources represent destination points within the trail network; others pose constraints or challen es to the development of the network, while others may present opportunities.

The Trails Plan

This plan component be ins with a discussion of various standards and uidelines for the desi n of trails and bicyclin facilities, describes various types of trails and recommends trail standards to be adhered to in the development of trails in the Township.

This section also identifies the 45 trails proposed as part of the township-wide trail network and provides a written description of each trail, some specifics about each trail such as proposed surface width, as well as the number of constraints such as brid es, easements, and road crossin s to be addressed in the development of the trail. Maps for each trail are provided as are summary tables outlinin the connectivity of each



trail to other trails, park facilities, commercial districts, schools and residential nei hborhoods. The new proposed trails have a combined milea e of .0 miles, which when coupled with the existin 5.4 miles of trails in the Township, will result in a network of 4 .4 miles of trails.
