BUCKS COUNTY TOUR OF HONOR



On Monday, September 26, 2016, 150 World War II and Korea Veterans departed PARX Casino, Bensalem in a six-bus convoy. Accompanied by 150 "Guardians", they were en route to Washington, DC as part of the first "Bucks County Tour of Honor". These Veterans would visit the Korea Memorial, US Air Force Memorial, the Iwo Jima Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, attend the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and conclude the Washington visit at the World war II Memorial. A wreath was placed by two Veterans at the Tomb. One gentleman was a 101-year old Navy Veteran and the other a 92-year old Medal of Honor recipient.

This was the Welcome Home that most of them never received when they returned from their tour of duty. Escorted by police as they traveled to D.C. they were even more surprised when, on the way home, they received not only a Police escort through rush hour traffic, but a motorcycle escort by members of "Warrior Watch" from the Pennsylvania State line.

Overpasses were manned by Fire and Police saluting them with flags flying as they passed in review. As they passed through Philadelphia, members of the Highway Patrol stop by the roadside saluting them and the Police Helicopter escorted the convoy up I-95 to their arrival back at PARX Casino. The convoy passed beneath the Plumstead Volunteer Fire Department's Flag which was suspended over Street Road as they turned into the Casino parking lot. At the Casino, they were greeted by over 500 people including High School marching bands, family members, Boy and Girl Scouts, Active Duty, Reserve and National Guard members, Honor Guards from the various Veteran Organizations and a myriad of Tour of Honor volunteers who collectively made this all happen.

Led by Joe Szafran and Christine Ferrara, a year's planning and coordination culminated in this Welcome Home. PARX Casino hosted a dinner and entertainment for the returning convoy.

Among the local Veterans honored were Pierson Burton, Jr (Korea), Leonard James (Korea) and "Woody" Kiel (Korea). "Woody" a past Plumstead Township Supervisor, was escorted by Supervisor Dan Hilferty. Jerry Fox served as a Bus Captain on one of the six (6) buses. Both Dan and Jerry are Army Vets and serve on the Plumstead Township Veterans Committee and are members of American Legion Post 210, Doylestown.

At the WW II Memorial, Dan and "Woody" were greeted by Congressman Mike Fitzpatick.

This area is always being captured on video, but not necessarily being viewed at that moment. In case of an emergency please dial 911.





BAMBOO! WHAT TO KNOW!

Bamboo is an extraordinary plant. There are more than one thousand (1000) types of it, and the growth rate of this plant is fascinating! It is the largest in the entire grass family, and can provide multiple uses for landscape purposes (i.e. barrier between properties). Other things to know about bamboo include:

- All bamboo are perennial evergreens
- Prefer loose soils to grow in
- Can grow up too 100cm in 24 hours

The only problem is, when not taken care of, bamboo can become quite a handful. If not maintained consistently, bamboo can:

- Become evasive to neighbors/encroach property lines
- Negatively impact pool and housing foundations, heating ducts, and other impervious surfaces
- Can affect the growth of other grasses and plants in the surrounding

This is why when you plan to use bamboo for landscape or construction purposes, it is important to think about ways to prevent any of these negatives impacts from occurring to you, or others around you. Some options that are around to maintaining bamboo include:




Figure 1: Running Bamboo Definitions

- Installing a rough plastic barrier 10-30 inches deep, with the soil around it being compacted (See Figure 1)
- Creating a moat around planting, with constant surveillance for any unwanted growth
- Cutting the shoots, causing the plant to eventually use too much energy for regrowth

Your Local Dollars at Work!

2016 has been a busy year for the Plumstead Public Works Department. From park improvements, to repairs and reconstruction of local roads; the Township has used its resources to maximize the result in a variety of ways. Below is a list of projects that the Public Works staff has been involved with this year.

Parks:

Jennifer Schweitzer Park Renovations:

A new solid surface was installed to replace the old tire chips that were in place.

Total Cost: \$26,214.32

Hanusey Park:

A well adjacent to the park was developed to provide water to irrigate the sports fields.

Total Cost \$59,000

Road Projects:

Silo Hill Road (lower portion):

Re-paving of .5 mile section of road between N. Easton Road and the gravel portion, and the section between Curly Hill Rd and the entrance to Owls Nest Park.

Total Cost: \$21,725.81

Silo Hill Road (upper portion):

Infrastructure work to improve storm drainage system in preparation for total reconstruction and paving by sub-contractor, between Stump Rd and Curly Hill Rd.

Total Cost: \$19,137.28

Reconstruction and paving bid was awarded to Blooming Glen Contractors, with work to be completed in October.

Total Cost: \$251,909.00

North Branch Development:

The roads in this residential development were microsurfaced over the summer. Microsurfacing extends the life of the roads, and delay the need for more costly milling and paving.

Total Cost: \$235,544.93

Potters Lane:

Re-paving of .5 mile section of road near Township Line Road.

Total Cost: \$18,786.98

Groveland Road:

Re-paving of .5 mile section of road between Route 413 and Moyer Road.

Total Cost: \$18,383.52

FIRE HYDRANTS

During a snow event when we're cleaning off cars, shoveling sidewalks and trying to keep our driveways open the last thing we might think about are the fire hydrants in the area. But precious time can be lost if the volunteer firefighters cannot locate a hydrant when responding to a call.

Township ordinance 2-7-95 adopted in 1995 requires every person in charge or control of any building or lot of land on which, or adjacent to which, is located a fire hydrant shall be required to uncover the hydrant to the extent that at least ½ of the hydrant shall be visible from the cartway (road).

PA ABLE Act to Help People with Disabilities

People with disabilities and their families face many challenges. Among them are planning for a financially secure future and saving for disability-related expenses. The Pennsylvania Achieving a Better Life Experience Act (PA ABLE), which was passed by the General Assembly on April 13, will provide families with a savings account without jeopardizing eligibility for important programs that their loved ones depend on

PA ABLE savings account benefits may include:

- Save up to \$14,000 each year.
- Savings grow tax-free.
- Use account to pay for a wide range of disability-related expenses.
- Withdrawals will be exempt from federal and state income tax when used for qualified disability expenses.
- Accounts would be exempt from inheritance tax.
- ABLE savings are excluded from eligibility determinations for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits (savings up to \$100,000), other means-tested federal programs, Medical Assistance, and other state means-tested disability and health benefits.

A second bill (HB1319) that would allow ABLE contributions (up to \$14,000 annually) is working its way through the legislative process.

The federal Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) Act was enacted in December 2014. (Division B at page 47). It provides federal tax and other benefits to eligible individuals with disabilities who save to meet qualified disability expenses through ABLE savings programs offered by states.

Residents along ALL township maintained roads are reminded that parking during a winter storm is limited based on the provisions set forth in Ordinance #2003-03. Parking is prohibited following the accumulation of one inch or more of snow or ice. Vehicles in violation of this ordinance are subject to towing and storage costs.


Each year, the township openly solicits local towing firms for a set cost to remove and store vehicles in violation of the ordinance. This information is posted on the township website for reference.

Residents are reminded to make guests and visitors to their home aware of this ordinance.

It would also be helpful if you could pass this information along to a new owner when selling a home.

Snow Shoveling Tips

- After a snowstorm, how many times have you shoveled your driveway or sidewalk only to have it plowed in?
- Public Works suggests that you wait until the street is cleared before you shovel the last five feet of your driveway or your sidewalk.
- Always clear an area to the right of your driveway (as seen in the diagram below) to give the snow on the blade of the plow a place to empty before it gets to your driveway. This way you won't have to do the same job twice.



• Public Works also reminds you that it is illegal to push snow from a parking lot or driveway onto a township roadway.

Winterizing your mailbox

- Public Works and the U.S. Postal Service are both expected to deliver during the winter season... come rain, sleet, snow, or all of the above. The location of your mailbox along the roadway can affect the efficiency of both mail service and snow plowing operations.
- Where is your mailbox located? Your letter carrier will make every effort to deliver the mail. However, if the mailbox is not
 accessible to the carrier due to snow buildup, or if it is not properly located along the road, you may have to pick up your
 mail at the post office.
- Plumstead Township allows property owners to place mailboxes within the township legal right-of-way, out of respect for the U.S. Postal Service's need to deliver, and mail customers' convenience of delivery; however, mailbox damage is the responsibility of the property owner.
- Normally, if a mailbox is placed as far from the shoulder of the road as the carrier can reach from a vehicle and the mailbox rests on a firm support, the mailbox should be able to withstand the force of snow from the plowing operation. Be sure your mailbox has a strong support. You also may wish to use reflective tape or other material to make the mailbox easier to see during storms or during dark hours.
- Plowing operations can push snow against or in front of mailboxes, limiting access and perhaps causing damage to supports.
- Check your mailbox and support often, clearing snow from it and depositing the snow properly (never shovel snow onto the road).

IT'S THE LAW!

Under Section 4524 of the PA Motor Vehicle Code, you can be issued a traffic citation if your windshield, side or rear windows are obstructed by ice or snow.

Under Section 3720 you can be issued a citation between \$200 - \$1000 if ice or snow falls from the roof of your vehicle, causing death or serious bodily injury to another motorist or pedestrian.






