The EAC's Arbor Day Celebration

Arbor Day, which is observed on the last Friday of every April, has been a national holiday for 145 years and celebrates the importance of trees. This year, in honor of Arbor Day, the Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) organized the planting of 3 heritage river birch trees and 5 young dawn redwood trees at Owls Nest Park, located at 5367 Silo Hill Road. The birch trees were planted next to the outdoor education center, and the redwood trees were planted near the parking lot. Tom Ladson, a fire forester from the PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, was in attendance and recognized Plumstead Township as being a member of Tree City USA for 12 years.

The EAC would like to thank: everyone who came out to help plant the trees; the Plumstead Township Public Works Department and Shan-Gri-La Contractors, LLC for their assistance with the planting; and Highland Farms for donating the redwood trees.

WHAT IS THE EXPLORERS PROGRAM? AND, WHAT DO THEY DO?



On Oct. 30, 2012 the Plumstead Twp Police Department partnered with Boy Scouts of America's Explorer Division as a way to engage the youth of the Central Bucks Community to provide an insight into the role police departments serve within the community.

In creating this program the police department had two goals: 1) Engage our youth in an authentic and meaningful way which would promote leadership skills as well as create an understanding of confrontation and conflict resolution 2) Establish the program as a legacy program in honor of our fallen hero Ofc. Joseph E Hanusey III, who died on May 18, 2002 while serving his community.

The program runs throughout the year and is open to boys and girls of the Central Bucks community between the ages of 14 and 21. Cadets assume roles within the same hierarchy as any police department with a Chief, Lieutenant, sergeants and cadets (assigned to squads). Instruction is lead by the cadets and supplemented by officers with expertise in various areas. Cadets are introduced to the elements which make up traffic and criminal laws and apply their understanding of these topics to various scenario based training such as: traffic stops, DUI's, domestic incidents, assaults, courtroom procedures and many other situations. They are also educated on the use of force law enforcement officers must apply to


potential situations and are taught how to deploy those use of force options, including firearms training. In addition to first hand experiences, cadets are exposed to the wide array of job opportunities within the law enforcement community.

Our explorers program also engages the community in many different ways through community service through programs we initiate, as well as through other organizations seeking our assistance. There is an initial \$25 fee assessed by the Boy Scouts of America for joining, however the program (uniforms, training experiences, etc.) are free. And, for cadets who meet our minimum standards the annual renewal fee is paid for by the post.

Our program has also created a scholarship program in honor of Joe Hanusey, in which cadets who wish to attend a post secondary school may compete for scholarship money. The program is funded through our annual May fundraiser called "Concert at the Farm" held at Hellerick Family Farm.

PUBLIC WORKS INFORMATION

WATER SYSTEM NOTES

Calls come in to the Public Works office from time to time regarding water quality concerns and excess use issues.

Potable water is provided to customers from ground water wells across the township. Most notable is the high, naturally occurring, mineral content (hardness) that can cause a light discoloration and sediment build up. The township addresses this concern by flushing the system through fire hydrants at least annually.

From time to time, we receive calls about "cloudy" water. In most all cases, this is simply air in the water. If you fill a clear glass from your tap and see cloudiness, let the glass sit for several minutes and the air will dissipate. You will know it was air even if you were to take a spoon and quickly stir the water in the glass. The water should remain clear. Air can enter the home plumbing through malfunctioning equipment or leaks.

In almost every situation when we receive a call regarding low or no pressure it is likely caused by something within the home, a whole house filter, specialized water treatment equipment or malfunctioning water softener, in rare cases such as a fire or a water main break these are the likely cause.

Each of these appliances requires some level of service

on a regular basis. Malfunctions including filters not being changed at regular intervals are a common cause for quality issues and excessive use.

A malfunctioning water softener that was installed and had never been serviced was the recent cause for an extremely high water bill. Thousands of gallons of water went "down the drain" and had to be paid for by the customer. Please consult owner's manuals and reputable service companies for more information on the proper management of these appliances. Adding salt and allowing the unit to automatically backwash are not the only things that need to be done to a water softener.

Finally, you can check your water usage by simply monitoring the water meter in your home. At a quiet time when no use is occurring, stand at your water meter. The numbers/dial should not be moving. If it is, you may have a toilet leaking or other appliance allowing water to flow freely. You can read your own meter on a daily, weekly or monthly basis and calculate your usage to see if you believe it to be within a normal range.

We have a responsibility to provide clean, safe water, and we do. While we cannot offer specific advise, we hope that these few general topics will be seriously considered as a part of your normal home maintenance and care.

REAL ID



The REAL ID Act, passed by Congress in 2005 requires changes to state standards, procedures and requirements for the issuance of driver's licenses and ID cards, if they are to be accepted as identity documents by the federal government.

PA does not currently meet these federal standards due to the passage, by the PA General Assembly, of Act 38 of 2012, which bars the Governor and PennDot from participating in REAL ID.

PA has been granted an extension until June 6, 2017 from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

While residents will not need an alternative form of federal approved identification for air travel until January 22, 2018, they will need a federally-approved form of identification to access federal buildings, nuclear power plants and military bases beginning June 7, 2017, unless another extension is granted by DHS.



CRIMEWATCH



The Plumstead Township Police Department along with numerous other police departments in Bucks County will soon use Crimewatch technology tool.

Imagine a crime happens in your neighborhood — a home break-in across the street, perhaps. A criminal is on the loose, and you don't know until you read about it the next day on social media or in the news, or you could just be entirely unaware it happened. Before 2012, that was a problem for Matt Bloom.

Where I live, you didn't know what's going on around you," he said. "The police are too small to be able to share information. There's just too much information for police to share effectively with the public."

Bloom, a resident of Adams County in Central Pennsylvania, wanted to combat the problem, so he developed Crimewatch, a technology company that immediately, effectively disseminates police information to the public.

Users can sign up to receive mobile alerts to their smartphones, and not just texts. The alerts may include an image of the offender and details about the arrest including time and location. There's also a centralized website and mobile application where that information is available, and it automatically pushes to Facebook and other social media outlets.

Bensalem Police Department started using Crimewatch in December and within about a week, it already started paying dividends. In one high-profile sexual assault case, police were able to get information leading to an arrest after Crimewatch spread the notice to about 18,000 people.

The Plumstead Township Police Department along with 25 other police departments will soon be joining the fold.


District Attorney Matt Weintraub secured an emergency management grant through the state that will ensure fund-

ing for Crimewatch in all departments across the county. When that goes live by the end of March, 120 departments in the state will be using the program, Bloom said.

Bucks County and Crimewatch tentatively worked out a three-year agreement, but law enforcement officials can evaluate and decide if it's something they want to keep after each year. For the first year, at least, it will cost the taxpayers nothing


The app uses location services to give information about crime or wanted criminals nearby. A criminal wanted by police across the country could pop up for his or her last known address was in Pipersville, for example.

It also works for residents who want to report crime. Anybody with information on an investigation can contact police directly through the app, and it keeps your identity secure. That way, tipsters don't have to fear backlash for identifying a criminal or assisting in an arrest. For information or to sign up for CRIMEWATCH, visit crimewatchpa.com.

Answer - Aaron Kratz – He was the founder of the Plumsteadville Carriage and Wagon Works which was well known for its fine craftsmanship and his carriages were sold up and down the East Coast of the United States and even in to Canada. At that time it was the largest industry in the area.

Dogs not spayed or neutered.....\$6.50
