

Justin is married to his wife Lillian and they and their children live in Milford New Jersey.


SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

A new school year is upon us and along with parents and students waking up early, packing lunches and helping young ones with homework, there's another big responsibility that we all have - bus stop safety! For the safety of our students, motorists must stop for a school bus that is engaged in picking up students. Pennsylvania has enacted strict laws to help stop motorists from disregarding flashing lights and stop arms on a school bus.

- Motorists must stop at least 10 feet away from school buses that have their red lights flashing and stop arm extended.
- Motorists must stop when they are behind a bus, meeting the bus or approaching an intersection where a bus is stopped.
- Motorists following or traveling alongside a school bus must also stop until the red lights have stopped flashing, the stop arm is withdrawn, and all children have reached safety.
- If physical barriers such as grassy medians, guide rails or concrete median barriers separate oncoming traffic from the bus, motorists in the opposing lanes may proceed without stopping.
- Do not proceed until all the children have reached a place of safety.

Penalties for violating the school bus stopping law includes a \$250 fine, five points on your driving record and a 60-day license suspension. Please help keep our young students safe and remember to stop for our school buses.



VETERANS COMMITTEE

Plumstead Memorial Day Observance, May 27, 2023 All gave some, some gave all.



As the sun shone brightly at Veterans Park on Saturday, May 27, 2023, the Plumstead Township Veterans Committee gathered to hold the second Memorial Day observance in remembrance of all who lost their lives defending the freedoms we enjoy today. Special emphasis was given to the six Plumstead residents who were casualties of conflicts.

The program began with Plumstead resident Scott Albert who played Amazing Grace on the bagpipes. Next was an introduction by Supervisor Dan Hilferty followed by the Invocation delivered by Alan Bleam, Director of Public Works. Our National Anthem was sung by Spencer Productions. The flag was lowered to half staff by the Doylestown Composite Squadron 907,

Civil Air Patrol. Taps was played by Kate Gutkind, Plumstead resident and Music Education major at Kutztown University. Committee member Aaron Gottshall spoke about remembering our POW's and MIA's. Committee member Ollie Groman discussed the history of Memorial Day and mentioned the six Plumstead residents who lost their lives serving our country.

Committee member Jim McComb spoke about Albert LeRoy Angeny of Danboro, a sailor who was lost at sea when his ship was hit by a Kamikaze bomber in World War II. A bridge was dedicated to LeRoy in May.

Aaron Gottshall spoke about Edward Berger Keller who lost his life serving our country in the Korean War. A bridge will be dedicated to Edward in July 2023. Aaron also spoke about Clifford Dale VanArtsdalen of Plumsteadville, a soldier who lost his life in the Vietnam War. Clifford will have a bridge dedicated to him at a future date.

Committee member Michelle Harvey spoke about William James Erkes Jr., a soldier who lost his life in the Vietnam War. A bridge in Bedminster was dedicated to William in May. Michelle also spoke about Leonard Frank Skoniecki Jr of Gardenville, a Marine who lost his life in the Vietnam War. Leonard will have a bridge dedicated to him at a future date.

Jim McComb spoke about Frank Elton Hilte of Danboro, a soldier who lost his life in the Vietnam War. Frank distinguished himself such that he was awarded the Bronze Star with V for valor. Frank will have a bridge dedicated to him in July 2023.

The program concluded with a musical tribute by Spencer Productions and the Benediction by Alan Bleam.

The Plumstead Veterans Committee is still trying to identify all veterans residing in our township. The 2020 US Census counts 521 veterans living in Plumstead. To date we have identified only 61 veterans. We would like to know our veterans so we can pass along information that may be pertinent to them and to provide any assistance that they may need. VETERANS COMMITTEE

IN MEMORY OF ALBERT LEROY ANGENY

A rainy day never is good for an outdoor event but the rain on May 20, 2023 did not stop the Plumstead Veterans Committee from dedicating a bridge in memory of Albert LeRoy Angeny. LeRoy, as he was called, was profiled, in detail, in an earlier newsletter. In short, he was an Electrician's Mate, 2nd Class serving aboard the USS Ommaney Bay. The ship was hit by a kamikaze bomber on January 4, 1945 and sustained heavy damage. LeRoy was one of 95 sailors who were lost at sea.

The bridge dedicated to LeRoy is located on Bergstrom Road between Landisville Road and Nottingham Way. Resolution 2023-10 was passed to authorize the dedication.





The ceremony began with Scott Albert playing Amazing Grace on the bagpipes. An honor guard from the Albert R. Atkinson Jr. Post 210 American Legion presented the colors. Alan Bleam, Plumstead Township Director of Public Works offered the invocation. Dave Gale sang the National Anthem. A flag line was set up by the Warriors Watch Riders. Supervisor Dan Hilferty presented the introduction and briefly discussed the Plumstead bridge dedication program. State Representative Shelby Labs presented a PA House Resolution to Doris Bleam, LeRoy's Sister. Congressman Brian Fitzpatrick presented a US House resolution to Doris along with a flag flown over the US Capitol. The signs were unveiled to the accompaniment of the Navy service song, Anchors Aweigh. Spencer Productions sang America the Beautiful and the event closed with the benediction by Alan Bleam.

It is said that a person has not died as long as there is one left in whom his memory remains. Every time we cross that bridge, we will see the name of LeRoy Angeny and think of him. He will not be forgotten.

There are four more bridge dedications to be done. The next one will be for Edward Berger Keller and that one will occur on July 15, 2023.

Sewage Management Program

Plumstead Township passed Ordinance No. 2021-05 known as the "Plumstead Township Sewage Management Ordinance".

This Ordinance is a Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection requirement and requires that all on-lot sewage disposal systems be pumped out by a licensed pumper/hauler selected by the property owner, at least once every three years. The three-year time shall begin when the system is approved as completed by the Bucks County Health Department.

This program began January 2023. If you can provide the Township with documentation or a receipt from your hauler that your system was pumped between 2019–2022, your records will be updated, and the three-year time clock will begin from your last pumping date.

- Check the venting system behind the dryer to make sure that it is not damaged, crushed or restricted.
- Make sure that the outdoor vent covering opens when the dryer is operating.






