

## Law Enforcement Officer of the Year

On March 6th, 2023, Corporal Michael Johnson was awarded "Law Enforcement Officer of the Year" by the members of Albert R. Atkinson Jr., American Legion Post 210 for his dedication and commitment to the Plumstead community. Corporal Johnson has worked tirelessly with the Plumstead Township Department since 2009. Before coming to Plumstead Township, Corporal Johnson worked for the Doylestown Township Police Department, beginning in 1980.



Corporal Johnson is a true leader in policing and an advocate in our community, driving many community engagement efforts throughout the year. The Plumstead Township Police Department takes part in "Coffee with a Cop" events held at local establishments, led by Corporal Johnson. In addition, each year the Plumstead Township Police Department hosts a Law Enforcement Night, bringing the police department and community together. Residents from throughout the community have the opportunity to interact with officers, see the equipment used by police, look through specialty vehicles and speak with other government service providers.

During the holiday season, Corporal Johnson spearheads our annual food drive, known as "Pack the Patrol Car". Each year, Corporal Johnson

works with our local food bank and shopping outlets to coordinate a day of food donations for the food bank. Shoppers donate non-perishable food items, filling a patrol car (or large trailer brought to the location). Corporal Johnson's efforts have directly led to the feeding of hundreds of families who are in need in our area. As the year ends, Corporal Johnson brings together officers from surrounding police agencies to take part in the annual "Shop with a Cop" event. In coordination with the Central Bucks School District, Corporal Johnson

#### Taxes Remaines Unchanged for the 2023

The Board of Supervisors passed the 2023 budget at the end of 2022, keeping taxes unchanged for the 5th year in a row despite significant inflationary pressures. The 2023 budget continues to prioritize providing emergency services. Half of the main General Fund is spent on law enforcement. The Board also increased funding to Point Pleasant EMS to assist them in paying wages to be more competitive in the market, introduced funding to Dublin Volunteer Fire, who is responsible for a portion of the township and established a new fund dedicated to assisting Plumstead Volunteer Fire, Point Pleasant Volunteer Fire and Point Pleasant EMS with capital equipment purchases. Other highlights include:

- Spending over \$1m to connect our water system in the southeast portion of the township to North Wales Water Authority, bringing better-quality water to the residents of Carriage Hill and Patriot's Ridge.
- Spending over \$1m on our township roads and another \$1m on equipment for our Public Works department to be used on maintenance of Township Roads and in our Parks.
- Increased funding for open space preservation.

The Township has been able to maintain tax rates while increasing our investments in emergency services and infrastructure due to aggressive debt service management in 2020 that reduced overall debt service payments by almost \$1m. Allocating resources wisely for the health, safety and welfare of the community is a crucial step in maintaining accustomed service levels that will enhance the quality of life currently enjoyed by our residents.

# **Land Preservation & Educational Committee**

#### **Conservation Easements Can Provide Significant Tax Savings**

Purchasing land conservation easements has been an important tool for the Township in its efforts to preserve land, manage growth and protect Plumstead's rural character, but it is not the only way to ensure that farmland, woodlands, and wetlands will be there for future generations. Donating conservation easements has become increasingly popular in recent years, and for good reason: because it can provide significant federal tax benefits. In fact, by donating a conservation easement a property owner can take a deduction equal to 50% — or in some cases, 100% — of their adjusted gross income for the year of the donation and up to 15 years thereafter.



For example, a landowner who earns \$100,000 per year and who donated a conservation easement appraised at \$1 million could take a \$50,000 deduction (50% of his or her income) the year of the donation and the next 15 years, thereby realizing deductions totaling \$800,000. (Note that the total deduction cannot exceed the total amount of the donation.) If the landowner qualifies as a farmer (someone receiving over 50% of their income from farming) the allowable deduction can rise to 100% of their adjusted gross income, and the deduction would be \$100,000 per year for 10 years, or a total deduction of \$1 million (the total appraised value of the donated conservation easement in our example).

To qualify for these federal tax benefits, a donated conservation easement must be for a property that contributes to the protection of natural, agricultural, or historic resources and the easement must be held by a public agency such as the Township and/or a land trust.

A conservation easement will limit certain uses of the property to protect its conservation values, but it allows the landowner and future owners to continue to enjoy and use the property in ways that do not hinder the conservation values. Most important, perhaps, a conservation easement provides a property owner with the peace of mind that his/her land will be protected and contribute forever to Plumstead's rural character.

# JAMES MCCOMB | CHAIRMAN





The Plumstead Veterans Committee is still trying to identify all veterans residing in our township. The 2020 US Census counts 521 veterans living in Plumstead. To date we have identified only 61 veterans. We would like to know our veterans so we can pass along information that may be pertinent to them and to provide any assistance that they may need. #### Two more Plumstead bridge dedications planned

"I'm proud to be an American, where at least I know I'm free. And I won't forget the men who died, who gave that right to me". – Lee Greenwood

With this thought in mind, the Plumstead Township Veterans Committee embarked on a program to dedicate township bridges in memory of those Plumstead residents who lost their lives serving our country, defending the freedoms we enjoy today.

In the Winter 2022 edition of the Plumstead Township newsletter, we stated that there will be two more bridge dedications in addition to those listed. The Plumstead veterans to be honored on these latest dedications will be Edward Berger Keller and Albert LeRoy Angeny.



Private Edward Berger Keller was born on October 25, 1925, the son of Edward and Ester (nee Berger) Keller. He had three sisters, Flora, Ruth, and Janette. The family lived on Applebutter Road.

Edward attended Western Brick school near Doylestown and was employed by Frank Meyers, plumber prior to his induction into the Army.

Edward was drafted and inducted into the Army on October 10, 1950. He received his basic training at Camp Atterbury, Indiana. He left the United States, bound for Korea, in March 1951. He arrived in Japan on April 1, 1951 and from there was sent to Korea to serve as a Light Weapons Infantryman with E Company, 2nd Battalion, 27th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division..

Edward was Killed in Action while fighting the enemy at Hill 486 near Yongchon, South Korea on April 16, 1951. He was 25 years old. It appears that he was in country for only about two weeks. He was awarded the Purple Heart, the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and the Korean War Service Medal.

Edward's remains were recovered and he is laid to rest with his parents in Doylestown Cemetery.

Albert LeRoy Angeny was born on September 10, 1921, the son of Clarence and Margaret Angeny, He had three sisters, Grace, Dorris, and Faye, and one brother, David.

Leroy graduated Doylestown High School in the class of 1939. He then worked for Angeny Brothers Construction in Danboro until he enlisted in the US Navy on April 19,1942 to serve his country. He served on the USS Ommaney Bay, an escort carrier, as an Electricians Mate (EM2/C).



On January 4, 1945, the Ommaney Bay was struck by a Japanese kamikaze warplane and the ship sustained heavy damage. Ninety-five sailors lost their lives that day, LeRoy was one of them.

LeRoy's parents visited him in Chicago before he shipped off to the Pacific theater. That was the last time they saw their son. LeRoy was lost at sea and is memorialized at the Manila American Cemetery in the Philippines and has a memorial grave in the Doylestown Cemetery.

LeRoy is honored with a Purple Heart, Combat Action Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal, Expeditionary Medal, American Campaign Medal, Navy and Marine Presidential Unit Citation, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal, and the World War II Victory Medal.

It is said that a person has not died as long as there is one left in whom their memory remains. Every time we cross these dedicated bridges, we will see their names and remember them.




