## **POLICE DEPARTMENT**



#### Detective William Mooney

On September 17th, 2023 Detective William Mooney ended his long career with the Plumstead Township Police Department and began his career working with the Bucks County District Attorney's Office as a Bucks County Detective.

## Presents Shop with a Cop!




Plumstead Township Police Department is preparing for their **SHOP WITH A COP!**

#### POLICE UPDATE - 2023:

#### **Grant Funding**

The Department has strived to be financially prudent, utilizing several sources of grant funding and taking advantage of reimbursements from several sources to offset training, special details and equipment. During the past years, the Plumstead Township Police Department has and will continue to benefit from grant funding to support major projects for the department. Grant funding has offset the cost of major upgrades to equipment and systems used by personnel each day.

- Department of Justice Body Worn Camera Implementation Grant Provided for Body Worn Camera Funding to Replace Aging System
- PCCD Local Law Enforcement Grant \$144,000 Provided for In-Car Camera System, In-House Video System and Automated License Plate Recognition Cameras The department continues to take advantage of on-going multi-jurisdictional grants and initiatives with other local police agencies.
- Office of Justice Programs Multi-Jurisdictional VSU Grant \$269,624 Provided Funding for Shared Victim Services Unit with Central Bucks Regional, Plumstead Twp., Doylestown Twp., Buckingham Twp.

 Federal COPS Grant – Multi-Jurisdictional Grant \$159,000 Provided for Training and Equipment for Nationally Recognized De-Escalation Program with Central Bucks Regional, Plumstead Twp., Doylestown Twp., Buckingham Twp.

#### **COMMUNITY EVENTS**

#### Law Enforcement Night

The Plumstead Township Police Department sponsored a Law Enforcement Night for residents to come out and meet local police, see K9 demonstrations, see medical helicopters and fire trucks and speak to other first responders. Held at Hanusey Park, residents enjoyed snacks and drinks donated by our local businesses.

Plumstead Township Police Department Explorer's Post 57-08 was established on November 3, 2013. The Law Enforcement Explorers program is designed to help young adults of the Central Bucks Communities to make a more informed decision about future careers and determine if a career in policing is right for them. Exploring is not about lectures and slides shows; it's about gaining practical experience in a career field. The program has been dedicated in the honor of fallen hero, Officer Joseph E. Hanusey III, who was tragically killed in the line of duty on May 18, 2002, in an auto accident.

#### Residential Key Box Program

. . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . .

Many times, officers respond to calls for medical assistance, responding to help our local ambulance service and to render aid. Officers have found that it is difficult to help in an emergency because the victim is inside their locked home. Plumstead Township Police Department continues to provide a residential lock program with the support of Wehrungs Lumber and Home Center, supplying key boxes to residents. These boxes hold a key for officers so that they may enter the home quickly to render aid. Only the police officer has the code for the box and, they are only used in the event of an emergency.

Pack the Patrol Car is always a success thanks to the volunteers, officers and our generous community who worked together to make this such a great event! All of the food donations are brought to Bucks County Housing Group; BCHG is a social service agency committed to serving low-income homeless families in Bucks County. We hope the donations received make the winter months a little more bearable for some families.

#### Shop with a Cop

In December, officers and staff participate in the Shop with a Cop event, coordinated by Cpl. Michael Johnson. Officers from surrounding police departments helped local youth and families shop for the holidays. The event hosted approximately 150 children from the Plumstead area. Santa was on hand and had some help from the officers and volunteers to help shop with the children. We could not have done this without the support and generous donations from our residents and businesses!

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### PW Projects Completed in 2023:

The Board of Supervisors, as part of the approved 2023 budget, approved over \$1 million dollars in funding, and the for the following road repair projects that were completed in 2023.

Public Works crews performed all necessary preparation work ahead of any contracted work which resulted in significant cost savings.

Projects completed include:

- paving of Bergstrom Road between Landisville Road and Pt. Pleasant Pike
- paving of Poplar Lane at Curly Hill Road
- micro-surface paving of all streets in the Durham Ridge development
  - Preparation work included base repair of failed travel lanes, replacement of 14 storm inlets to ensure proper drainage and connection of sump pump lines to eliminate standing water and icing during the winter months.
- rubberized asphalt crack sealing in Fox Hunt, Summer Hill, Windtree, Country Greene and Estates of Brookside developments
- bituminous sealcoat application on McNeil, Ridgeview, Twin Silo, Covered Bridge, Schlentz Hill, Shad and Rodgers Roads
  - Preparation work included roadside ditch cleaning to promote proper storm run off and base repair of failed travel lanes
- replacement of a failed drainage pipe on Gayman Road

Additionally, Public Works crews did base repair work at the township administration building to prepare for repaving of the parking lot. The original paving was completed in 1994.

Public Works crews also designed and installed a 925-foot walking path along Potters Lane at Jennifer Schweitzer Park. The path connects to the tot lot area at the park and provides an area, off-street, to walk to the park. Crews installed a stone base and then paved the path 6 feet wide. They had to overcome storm drainage obstacles while maintaining the efficiency of the run-off.

Six segments of walking paths were repaved in the Cabin Run development. These paths were installed in the mid-1990's when the homes were built and provide inner-connected access within the community and to the sidewalk on Stump Road in the Plumsteadville village.







## CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP AND RECYCLING

Christmas tree pickup and recycling will take place the week of January 8, 2024 and January 15, 2024

Please place trees curbside, separate from your trash containers. Decorations and lights must be removed, or the tree will not be taken.

Crews will travel to all public roads within the township, including HOA maintained development streets.

Each street will be travelled once per week, each week. Trees must be curbside by 7am each Monday.

Crews will not return to pick up individual trees.

#### From the Point Pleasant Fire Company

What Do you do when you see an emergency vehicle......

Drivers in Pennsylvania are **required to move over or slow down when they see an emergency vehicle** or disabled vehicle or face fines.

- Pennsylvania's "Move Over Law" went into effect in 2021.
- Drivers face fines of \$500 for a first offense up to \$2,000 for a third offense. Driver's license will also be suspended upon a third or subsequent offense.
- The rules of the road in Pennsylvania have changed to protect first responders. Starting in 2021, drivers need to "move over" or slow down when they see flashing lights or face fines.

The **"Move Over Law"** calls for drivers to move into to the left lane when approaching an emergency vehicle with lights flashing -- including police officers, EMS crews and tow truck drivers -- or a disabled vehicle with proper indicators set up. If the driver can't safely move into the outer lane on a highway or multilane road, then the driver needs to slow to 20 mph under the speed limit.

"Many drivers seem to think that moving over is just an optional courtesy when they see law enforcement or emergency vehicles pulled over on the side of the road," Pennsylvania State Police Trooper Jessica Tobin said. "Emergency personnel can only do so much to keep themselves safe when they pull over on the side of the road. The rest of the responsibility falls on other motorists."

Drivers who don't give space or slow down face fines of \$500 for a first offense up to \$2,000 for a third or subsequent offense. A driver will have his or her license suspended for 90 days upon a third offense. A driver faces a fine up to \$10,000 for a crash that hurts or injures a person.



## **EMS** continued

#### FIRE SAFETY TIP - DISCARD FIREPLACE ASHES PROPERLY

Every year fire departments in the Bucks County area have respond to house fires caused by improperly discarded fireplace ashes. Our personnel have responded to multiple fires over the past few winter's caused by improperly discarded fireplace ashes.

**FACT:** Many people don't realize the length of time required for ashes to cool enough for disposal. Coals and ashes from fires can remain hot enough to reignite and start a fire for many days after the fire is out. The exact amount of time for complete extinguishment and cooling depends on many factors such as how hot the fire was, what was burning, how much unburned fuel remains, etc.



**BE SAFE:** Treat ALL ashes and coals as HOT ashes, even when you think they had time enough to cool. Take care to dispose of them wisely. Your house, deck or garage are unsafe locations for storing ashes while they cool and have been the site of many recent and devastating fires both locally and nationally. Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep it outside and at least 10 feet from your home or nearby buildings.

#### Follow these simple fire safety tips:


- Clean and inspect your chimney at least once a year and again after every cord of wood burned.
- Do not discard your ashes into any combustible container such as a paper or plastic bag, a cardboard box, or a plastic trash can.
- Do not place ash containers on decks, porches or in garages.
- Put ashes into a non-combustible metal container with a lid.
- Pour water into the container to make sure the ashes are cool.
- Keep your can OUTSIDE the home, away from your fireplace or stove and anything combustible.
- Teach all family members to be safe with ashes from your fireplace or wood stove.

## LAND PRESERVATION AND EDUCATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

### REDUCING ESTATE TAX WITH A CONSERVATION EASEMENT

Did you know that federal estate tax can be substantially reduced by placing a conservation easement on your property? Besides the benefits available by donating a conservation easement during your lifetime (saving up to 50% of your adjusted gross income for as long as 15 years as well as a reduction in local taxes), your heirs can also benefit from the donation of a conservation easement. Federal estate tax law values land under easement at its restricted value. Since conservation easements in the township eliminate development potential in perpetuity this benefit can reduce the amount of estate tax your heirs need to pay—and can sometimes ensure that the value of the estate falls under the taxable threshold.

In addition to the benefit of a reduced land value for estate purposes, up to 40% of the value of the conserved land (capped up to \$500,000) can be **excluded** from the value of the deceased person's estate. This tax advantage is available whether the donation of a conservation easement occurs during your lifetime, by will, or placed by your heirs. Although most estates fall below the exemption threshold (\$12.92 million in 2023), those with large financial and/or multiple property assets can clearly benefit. Like any federal tax program, it is important that the easement conforms with the tax code and that the required reporting process is followed. Discussing with your legal and/or financial advisor(s) is highly recommended to learn how you and your estate can take advantage of these benefits.

#### **BRIDGES DEDICATIONS**

Since the last newsletter, the Plumstead Township Veterans Committee has dedicated two more township bridges to Plumstead residents who lost their lives serving our country.

On July 15, 2023 the bridge on Potters Lane, near Downs Run, was dedicated to Private Edward Berger Keller, US Army. Edward was born on October 25, 1925. Private Keller was drafted into the Army on October 10, 1950. After completion of basic training, he was sent to South Korea via Japan. He was killed in action on April 16, 1951 after being in country for about two weeks. Edward's cousin Bob Keller of Plumstead, was present at the dedication.

On September 9, 2023, the bridge on Old Easton Road by Penn Engineering was dedicated to Staff Sergeant Frank Elton Hilte. SSgt Hilte was born on April 10, 1930. He initially joined the Army on July 8, 1948. He served a number of tours



in Germany before getting orders for Vietnam in October 1967. During the Tet Offensive of 1968, Frank was serving as an Artillery Forward Observer with a South Vietnamese Army unit when he was mortally wounded by small arms fire in Binh Duong Province. During the battle that day, Frank distinguished himself such that he was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star with V for Valor, our nation's fourth highest award for bravery. Frank's son Ken flew in from Colorado for the bridge dedication.

There are two more bridge dedications to be done and they will occur in 2024. One for Sergeant Leonard Skoniecki US Marine Corps and the other for Specialist Fourth Class Clifford VanArtsdalen, US Army.


